Learning Outcomes	The curricular unit of Policies and Incentives for Urban Rehabilitation and Regeneration aims to study urban interventions aimed at improving the quality of life of the population on one given territory. Stimulating critical thinking about the existing urban space, encouraging the student in knowledge about the potential of the current instruments of planning and rehabilitation. 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Evidence of the syllabus coherence with the curricular unit's intended learning outcomes	The objective of the curricular unit is to give the student knowledge about the potential of the current planning and rehabilitation instruments as well as the acquisition of knowledge regarding legislation and incentives for rehabilitation, so that the program content is in the realm of property law and urban law, applicable to the building to be rehabilitated and opportunities to support rehabilitation projects.
Evidence of the teaching methodologies coherence with the curricular unit's intended learning	The incentive to rehabilitation emerges as a relevant need in the current critical situation of the construction sector, but may also represent an excellent opportunity to leverage the energy rehabilitation of buildings. In this sequence, the curricular unit is perfectly integrated with the rest of the syllabus and enables the development of new technical skills in rehabilitation. The objective of the curricular unit is the acquisition of knowledge related to the legislation and incentives to the rehabilitation reason why the programmatic contents are of the theoretical-practical aspect.
